The **Great White Fleet** was the popular nickname for the United States Navy battle fleet that completed a circumnavigation of the globe from December 16, 1907, to February 22, 1909, by order of U.S. President Theodore Roosevelt.

It consisted of 16 battleships divided into two squadrons, along with various escorts. Roosevelt sought to demonstrate growing American military power and blue-water navy capability. Hoping to enforce treaties and protect overseas holdings, the U.S. Congress appropriated funds to build American sea power. Beginning with just 90 small ships, over one-third of them wooden, the navy quickly grew to include new modern steel fighting vessels. The hulls of these ships were painted a stark white, giving the armada the nickname "Great White Fleet".

Profile of My Embroidered Silk Card Collection by Lorenzo Giardiello

Being a retired engineer with plenty time on my hands, I pursued the dream of a 12 year old boy of one day being a stamp collector. In 1971 given the opportunity I joined a local stamp club and few years later I also became a member of the Postal Stationary Club. Early in the 1980s I went to a meeting of the PSC where a fellow collector with a proposition approached me. Aftersome discussion I became the proud owner of a beautiful French embroidered silk postcard collection including the 1975/6 catalogues by 'C. Radley, which at the time, were the only known references available for embroidered silk postcards.

Because of the very little information available in them about this card type, years passed while I wondered how to add relevant information in regards to the cards or how to mount this collection. I was encouraged to do so by some eager club members as they wanted to see them exhibited. At first the cards were mounted in especially made-up black folders and were initially displayed at the Edwardstown Stamp Club, an Adelaide suburban local club, where I was delighted to see that all of the members enjoyed them.

I was not satisfied with the little I could use from Radly's books as they were predominantly about British Military Corps. The 1994, John Southland and the 2001, Dr. Ian Collins catalogues were also leaning heavily on those same British Military Corps cards making my task of gaining further knowledge on the subject difficult.

Other collector's suggestions and associated personal deductions with later internet research including the patience of a friend and editor, helped play a great part in achieving not only the National West Australia and New Zealand gold medals in 2013 with the Judges', 'best in show' prizes but also the present result of an International Gold medal and the second Judge's prize obtained recently at International Canakkali, Turkey on 18-25 March 2015, which also included the one frame, 'Rifle Marksman' where it was awarded a Vermeil.

This silk card collection is formed of 128 pages (8 frames) of well researched and annoted pages forming a most attractive kaleidoscope of colour in a variation of designs and presented in a thematic order which has won not only the above competition prize but also the favourable reaction from members when displayed at local clubs.
