The Spanish Flu arrived in Australia in early 1919, mainly in Sydney and Melbourne, carried by soldiers returning from the First World War. It was so severe that theatres, churches, schools and race meeting were closed, but apparently formal social distancing was not attempted. In an attempt to stop the disease spreading northwards, the Queensland - NSW border was closed without notice on Thursday 29 January, 1919.

The closure had a big affect in the twin towns of Tweed Heads, in NSW, and Coolangatta in Queensland, which then, as now, operated as a single township. How social networking actually dates back to much earlier than initially thought, to more than a hundred years ago.



Travelling at a mile per minute, to look out and enjoy the countryside as it slowly gets you to your destination


A vote of thanks was given by Tony Presgrave who mentioned that one of his ancestors was involved in the rail services back then.



Our President brought along an interesting card. Not necessarily the front so much as the back showing different types of goods. That the company was promoting.



EDINBURGH CASTLE

It is a historic fortress which dominates the skyline if Edinburgh the capital of Scotland. It is located at the top of the Royal Mile, at the west end of Edinburgh's old town.

There has been a royal castle on the rock since at least the reign of David I in the 12th century and the site continued to be a royal residence until 1633. From the 15th century it was principally used as a military barracks with a large garrison. It is an importance part of Scotland's national heritage and various restoration programmes have been carried out over the past century. Research in 2014 identified 26 sieges in its 1100 year old history giving it a claim to having been one of the most besieged places in Scotland and one f the most attacked in the world.

Murray Studios



A long and proud tradition was started in 1908 when "a canvas structure that was erected at the back of the premises did service as a photographic room." This quote from an issue of The Gympie Times in 1941 described the humble beginnings of Murray Studios by Fred Murray.

In 1929, determined to keep his company and staff together during the hard times of the Great Depression, Fred created a new Department and called it Murray Views. He proposed to supply postcards of local views to neighbouring holiday centres.
